Beginning in 2008, three organizations; Kacia, The Pink Brigade and the Sheboygan County Cancer Care Fund – have joined together to offer the community the Fashion for Hope Style Show that celebrates community, family and life. During this 5 year tenure, every hour worked, every silent auction and raffle item, every advertising dollar, every complimentary food and drink item - have been donated by a very generous community of SCCCf supporters. Because of this, we are proud to say 100% of our proceeds have been donated to the Sheboygan County Cancer Care Fund totaling to date nearly \$56,000. We thank you for continuing to support our efforts!

The Sheboygan County Cancer Care Fund

In 2000 a group of concerned community members came together at the request of local oncologist Dr. H. Marshall Matthews to discuss his vision of creating a fund to assist local cancer patients meet the many financial challenges of a cancer diagnosis. In 2001 the Sheboygan County Cancer Care Fund (SCCCF) was incorporated and approved by the IRS as a 501(c)(3) Exempt Organization.

The primary mission of the SCCCf is to offer financial assistance, known as gestures, to cancer patients to help them cope with the many physical, emotional, and financial challenges of a cancer diagnosis. Since its inception, the SCCCf has distributed more than \$700,000 in approved financial gestures to local cancer patients and survivors.

In addition, the SCCCf offers "life-enhancing activities" designed to assist cancer patients and survivors live healthier and more active lives following a cancer diagnosis. Programs such as "Gentle Yoga for Cancer Patients & Survivors," "Massage & Reiki for Cancer Patients," "Survive, Thrive & Be Fit," and "Active Survivors of Sheboygan" are all offered at no cost.

The SCCCf is unique amidst the many cancer organizations in that it helps those individuals right here in our own community who have been diagnosed with cancer as they face the real-life day-to-day challenges of a cancer diagnosis!
